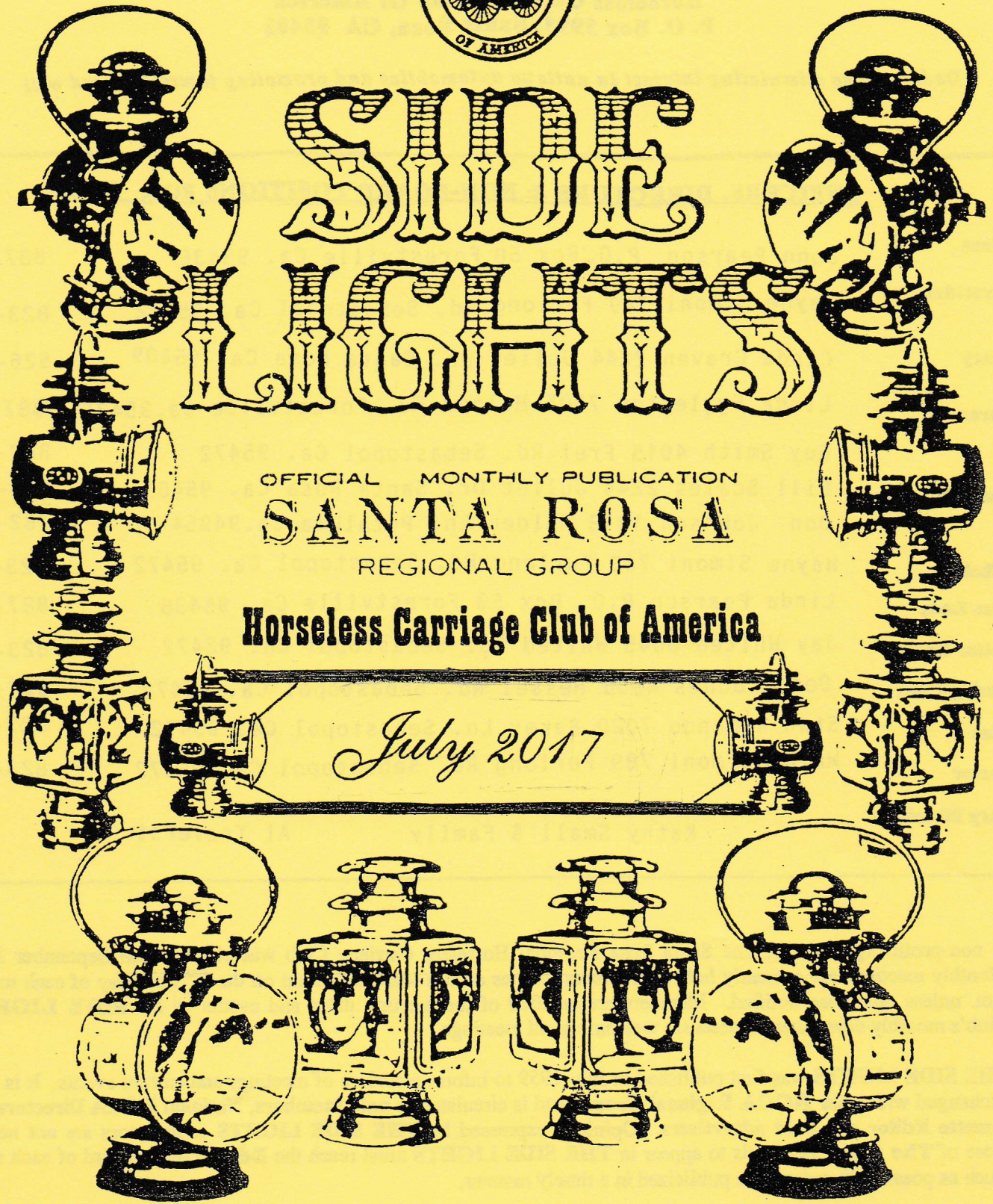

The Ramada Inn has a pool and a playground.

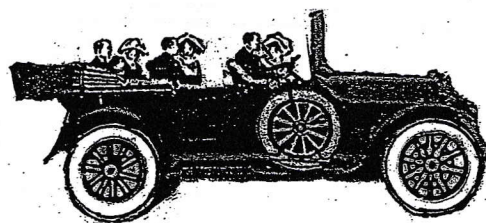
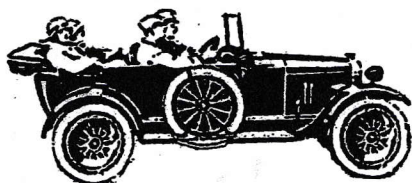
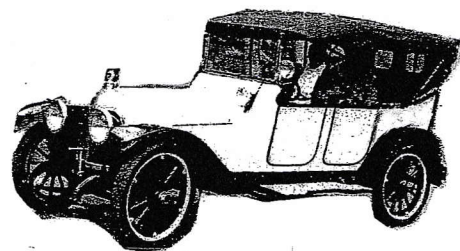
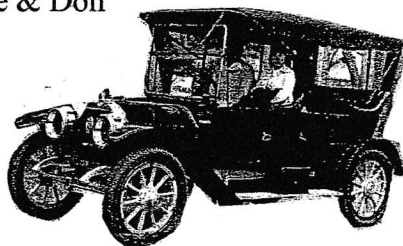
We encourage vintage clothing, but on Tuesday or Thursday you will go on a boat ride from Mount Desert Island. Dress accordingly.

The tour was built around visiting selected artists' studios around west county:

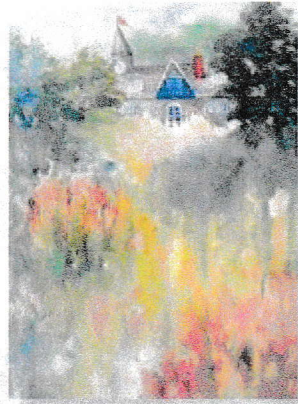

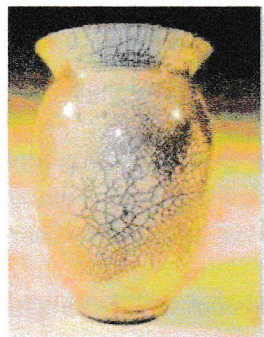

ACCC Legislative Status Report June 2017

AB 1

(Frazier D) Transportation funding. (Introduced: 12/5/2016 [Text](#))
Status: 1/19/2017-Referred to Coms. on TRANS. and NAT. RES.
Current Location: 1/19/2017-A. TRANS.Referred to SB1

Summary: Would create the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Program to address deferred maintenance on the state highway system and the local street and road system. The bill would require the California Transportation Commission to adopt performance criteria, consistent with a specified asset management plan, to ensure efficient use of certain funds available for the program. The bill would provide for the deposit of various funds for the program in the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account, which the bill would create in the State Transportation Fund.

AB 65

(Patterson R) Transportation bond debt service (Introduced: 12/5/2016 [Text](#))
Status: 4/19/2017-Referred to Coms. on TRANS. and NAT. RES.
Current Location: 1/19/2017-A. TRANS.

Summary: Existing law provides for transfer of certain vehicle weight fee revenues to the Transportation Debt Service Fund to reimburse the General Fund for payment of current year debt service on general obligation bonds issued for transportation purposes, including bonds issued for high-speed rail and associated purposes pursuant to the Safe, Reliable High-Speed Passenger Train Bond Act for the 21st Century (Proposition 1A of 2008). This bill would specifically exclude from payment under these provisions the debt service for Proposition 1A bonds.

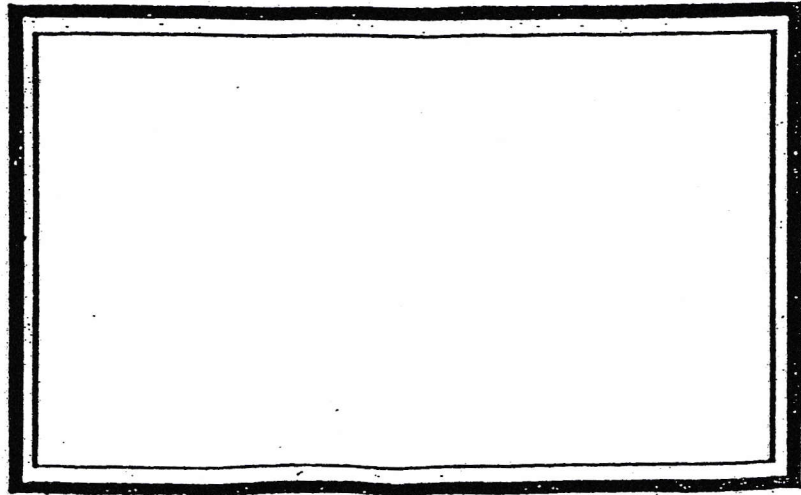

The bill would require the California Transportation Commission to adopt performance criteria, consistent with a specified asset management plan, to ensure efficient use of certain funds available for the program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.
