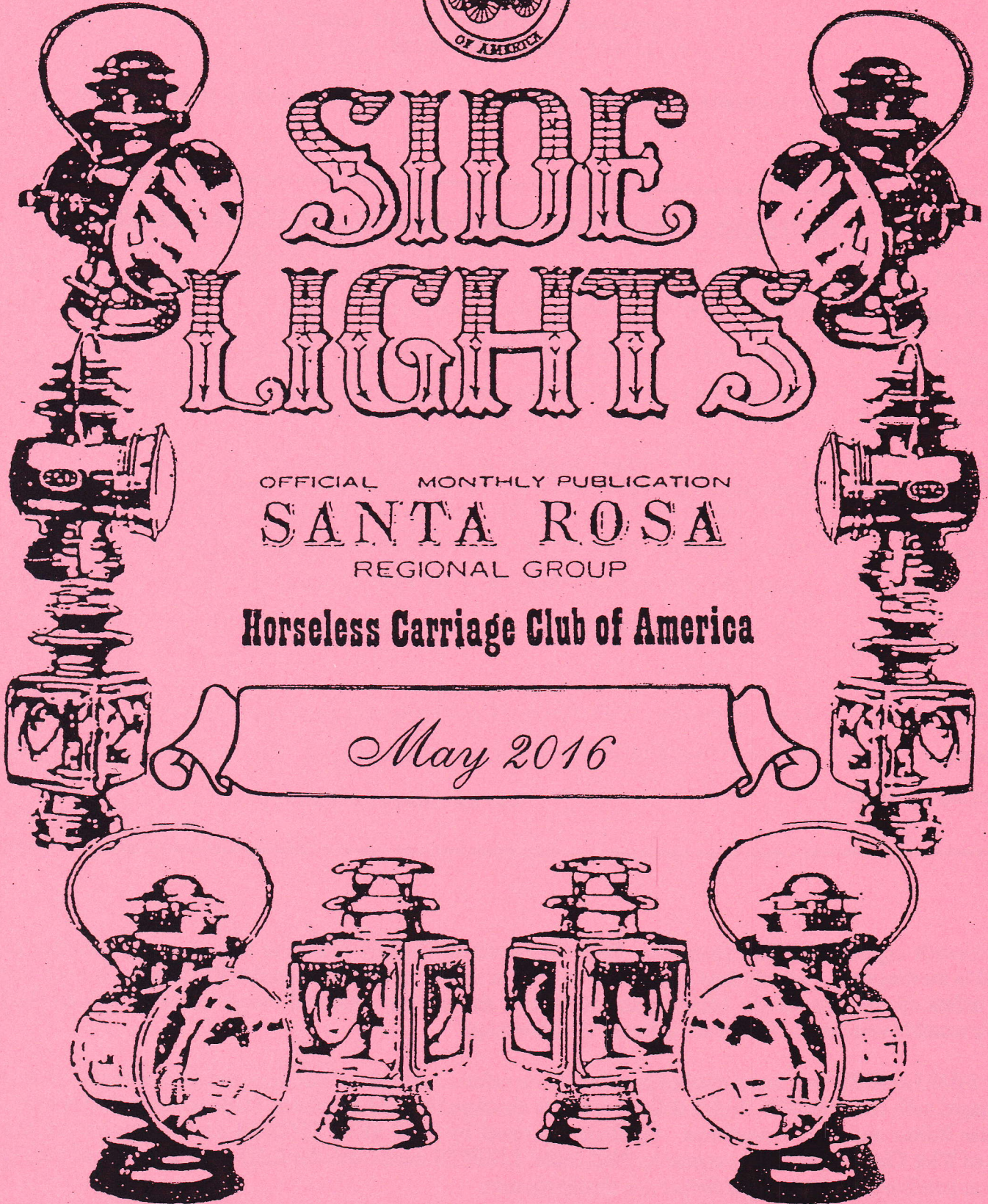

AB 210

(Gatto D) High-occupancy vehicle lanes: County of Los Angeles. (Vetoed: 9/28/2015 [pdf](#) [html](#))
Status: 9/28/2015-Vetoed by the Governor
Current Location: 9/28/2015-A. VETOED

Summary: Would prohibit, commencing July 1, 2016, any high-occupancy vehicle lane from being established on specified portions of state highway routes in the County of Los Angeles, unless that lane is established as a high-occupancy vehicle lane only during the hours of heavy commuter traffic, as determined by the Department of Transportation. The bill would require any existing high-occupancy vehicle lane established on the specified portions of these routes to be modified to conform with those requirements.

(Waldron R) Smog check: exemption: fee. (Amended: 1/4/2016 [pdf](#) [html](#))
Status: 1/15/2016-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(b)(1). (Last location was TRANS. on 1/4/2016)
Current Location: 1/15/2016-A. DEAD

Summary: Would allow owners of certain motor vehicles that are subject to the smog check program to pay a \$200 smog abatement fee in lieu of passing a smog test if the motor vehicle meets specified criteria. The bill would require the fee to be deposited in the Air Quality Improvement Fund. This bill contains other existing laws.

(Daly D) Specialized license plates: professional sports. (Amended: 7/15/2015 [pdf](#) [html](#))
Status: 8/28/2015-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(11). (Last location was APPR. on 8/27/2015)
Current Location: 8/28/2015-S. 2 YEAR

Summary: Would require the Department of Parks and Recreation to apply to the DMV to sponsor a license plate program for the issuance of license plates bearing the officially licensed logo, emblem, or trademark provided by a California professional sports franchise, upon entering into a memorandum of understanding with the franchise to participate in the program.

The bill would also require, except as specified, an automotive repair dealer to use the oil drain interval specified in the maintenance schedule of the vehicle's owner's manual if the automotive repair dealer is recommending the date or mileage for the next oil change, as described.

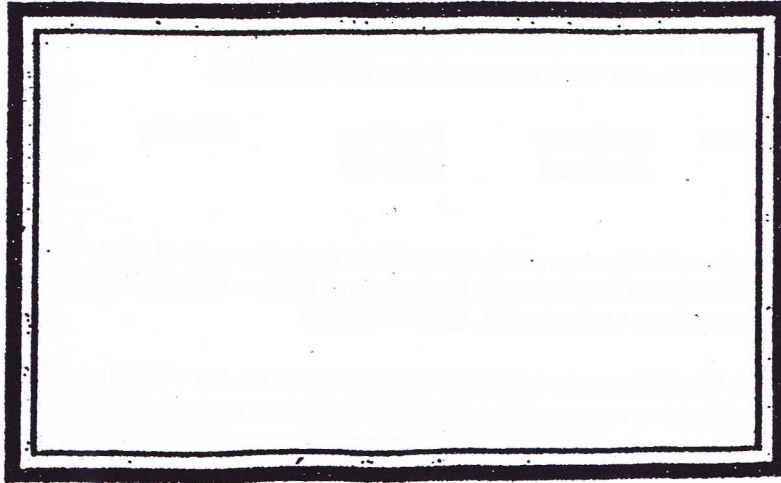

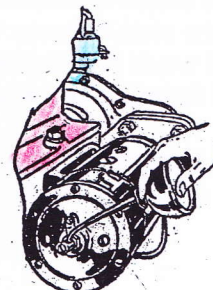

GENERATOR

Consult instruction book for your particular make of generator.

A generator demands little attention, but it should have it at regular intervals. Twice a month put three or four drops of cylinder oil in the oil wells. Do not for any reason put oil or grease on the commutator.

It is a good plan to clean the commutator when it becomes gummed. Crocus cloth can be used to advantage if the copper surfaces are thoroughly wiped with a cloth—never use emery or sand paper for cleaning commutators.
